Mr. Marc B. Nathanson is currently Co-Chair of the Board of Directors at the Pacific Council on International Policy. In 2012, Secretary of State, Hillary Clinton, appointed Mr. Nathanson as her representative to the Board of the East-West Center in Honolulu, Hawaii. Mr. Nathanson is Vice Chair of the National Democratic Institute for International Affairs, and was founding Chair of the Homeland Security Advisory Council (HSAC) for Los Angeles. He previously founded and served as Chairman and CEO of Falcon Cable TV. Mr. Nathanson additionally served as Chairman of the Broadcasting Board of Governors during the Clinton and Bush Administrations (1995-2002). He was also a member of the Presidentially-appointed Albanian Enterprise Fund. He is a member of the Board of Trustees of the Aspen Institute, and Center for the Digital Future at USC. Mr. Nathanson is also a member of the Los Angeles Coalition for the Economy and Jobs, and the Council on Foreign Relations.

He co-founded Trident Capital, a Palo Alto based venture capital firm. In addition to his long, successful career in business, Ambassador Schnabel has had a distinguished career in the U.S. Government, serving as U.S. Ambassador to Finland (1986-1989), U.S. Ambassador to the European Union (2001-2005), and Acting Secretary of Commerce (1991-1992). He served in the United States Air Force reserves for 6 years and was a member of the Los Angeles Olympic Committee, Chairman of the Los Angeles Convention and Visitors Bureau, and President of the Fire and Police Pension Fund. He was the former President of Bateman Eichler, Hills Richards, Inc. (Wells Fargo Bank). Mr. Schnabel has served on the board of numerous public and private companies in the United States, Europe, and Asia. He is a member of the Council on Foreign Relations in New York and a member of The USC Center on Public Diplomacy Advisory Board of the Annenberg School and he attended Trinity College in Europe.

Dr. Jerrold D. Green

Dr. Jerrold D. Green is the President and Chief Executive Officer of the Pacific Council on International Policy in Los Angeles. He is also a Research Professor of Communications, Business, and International Relations at the University of Southern California. Prior to this he served as a Partner at Best Associates in Dallas, Texas, a privately held merchant banking firm with global operations. He also served as the Director of International Programs and Development at the RAND Corporation where he oversaw the activities of the Center for Asia-Pacific Policy as well as the Center for Russia and Eurasia. At the same time he directed RAND's Center for Middle East Public Policy.

Green has a B.A. (*summa cum laude*) from the University of Massachusetts/Boston, as well as an M.A. and Ph.D. in Political Science from the University of Chicago. His academic career began at the University of Michigan where he was a professor in the Department of Political Science and the Center for Near Eastern and North African Studies. He subsequently joined the University of Arizona where he became a Professor of Political Science and Sociology as well as Director of the Center for Middle Eastern Studies. Green has lived and worked in Egypt, where he was a Fulbright Fellow, Iran, and Israel. He has lectured on six continents and been a visiting fellow at the Chinese Academy of Social Science's West Asian Studies Center in Beijing; a visiting lecturer at the Havana based Center for African and Middle East Studies (CEAMO), a fellow at the Australian Defense College, and delivered papers at conferences sponsored by the Iranian Institute of International Affairs in Tehran. Green has led three U.S. Department of Defense sponsored Pacific Council delegations to Afghanistan and another to Iraq as well as Pacific Council delegations to China, Cuba, North Korea, Turkey, South Sudan, Myanmar, China, Russia, Kazakhstan, Uzbekistan, Qatar, the United Arab Emirates, Argentina, and numerous other countries. He has also represented the Pacific Council as an observer at the legal proceedings being conducted at Guantánamo Bay, Cuba, by the U.S. Department of Defense. Green is a member of the Council on Foreign Relations, The California Club, the Lincoln Club, the U.S. Department of State Advisory Committee on International Economic Policy (ACIEP), and the Advisory Board of the Center for Public Diplomacy at the University of Southern California. He is a member of the United States Secretary of the Navy Advisory Panel where he was awarded the Department of the Navy, Distinguished Civilian Service Award for his service. Green also served on the Selection Committee for the U.S. Department of State Herbert Salzman Award for Excellence in International Economic Performance by a Foreign Service Officer. He is currently a Reserve Deputy Sheriff with the Los Angeles Sheriff's Department, and has previously served as a Specialist Reserve Officer with the Los Angeles Police Department where he advised on terrorism and Middle East issues. Green serves on the Board of Managers of Falcon Waterfree Technologies, is a member of the Los Angeles Coalition for the Economy and Jobs Tourism Committee, and is an International Medical Corps Ambassador. Dr. Green has previously served on the Advisory Board of the Suu Foundation headed by Nobel Prize Winner Aung San Suu Kyi in Burma/Myanmar, the Board of Directors of the California Club, the Advisory Committee of The Asia Society of Southern California, the Advisory Board of Whitney International University, the Advisory Board of Academic Partnerships, and the Board of Columbia University's Middle East Institute in New York. Dr. Green is currently a technical advisor to Activision Publishing in Santa Monica, California, where he consults on the highly successful *Call of Duty* series. Green has written widely on Middle East themes focusing on American Middle East policy, the role of religion in the region, inter-Arab relations, Iranian politics, and the Arab-Israeli conflict. Ms. Nancy A. Aosse

Nancy A. Aosse is President & CEO of Los Angeles-based International Medical Corps, whose staff of 7,800 and thousands of volunteers provides emergency relief and training on the frontlines of war, natural disaster and disease. Aosse joined International Medical Corps as its startup CEO, shortly after its founding in 1984. She went on to establish the organization as a preeminent first responder, launching its early humanitarian activities in Afghanistan, Pakistan, Angola, Rwanda, Somalia, and the Balkans. She has transformed it into one of the largest humanitarian organizations, delivering \$2 billion of assistance and training to tens of millions of people in more than 70 countries. International Medical Corps has responded to every major disaster of the last 30 years and helps build self-reliance including: the civil war and famine in Somalia; genocide in Rwanda; the Indian Ocean

tsunami; the Haiti and Nepal earthquakes; the Japan earthquake and tsunami; the Philippines typhoon; conflicts in Syria, Darfur, and Afghanistan; and West Africa's Ebola outbreak. Aossey has testified before Congress, briefed the White House, and been interviewed by the major media. She serves on the Board of Directors of the Pacific Council on International Policy, the Ronald Reagan UCLA Medical Center, Her Majesty Queen Rania Al-Abdullah's Jordan River Foundation/USA, and the Advisory Board of the RAND Center for Middle East Public Policy. Aossey is a member of the Council on Foreign Relations, the Young Presidents' Organization/World Presidents' Organization, and the Chief Executives Organization. Her awards and honorary doctorates include: the UCSF Medal, the YPO's Global Humanitarian Award, and its Legacy Award; the Goldman Sachs 100 Most Intriguing Entrepreneurs; and the Los Angeles Business Journal's Non-Profit CEO of the Year/Women Making a Difference Award. Aossey holds a BA, an MBA and an honorary doctorate from the University of Northern Iowa.

Mr. Astani received his Master's Degree in Engineering from the University of Southern California ("USC"). In 2007, he made a generous donation to the civil engineering department, now named the "USC Sonny Astani Department of Civil and Environmental Engineering." It remains the largest naming gift for a civil engineering department. In addition, Mr. Astani has donated \$3.5 Million to the Skid Row Housing Trust, which provides housing for homeless and battered women and children, Dorsey High School, and Compton Junior Posse. Mr. Astani serves on the Board of Councilors for the USC Viterbi School of Engineering, the USC Lusk Center for Real Estate, and the Pacific Council for International Policy. He has been awarded the USC Engineering School's Distinguished Alumni Award and the Industrial and Systems Engineering Distinguished Award. Ambassador Frank E. He is the former Ambassador to the Oriental Republic of Uruguay, where he served from November 2006 to January 2009. Ambassador Baxter is Chairman of the Board of Alliance for College-Ready Public Schools, a charter management organization with twenty-eight middle and high schools; Chairman of the Board of Fremont College, a career college; Board member of the University of California Berkeley Foundation. He is a board member of EDVOICE, an educational advocacy group in Sacramento; Los Angeles County Museum of Art; Los Angeles Opera; Music Center Foundation; and St. John's Health Center Foundation. He is a Trustee of I Have a Dream Foundation, LA Chapter. Howard Berman is a senior advisor with Covington and Burling LLP, based in both Washington and LA offices. 1982, Congressman Berman became known as one of Capitol Hill's preeminent deal-makers. As the chairman of the House Foreign Affairs Committee, Congressman Berman was one of Congress' leading experts on international relations. On the Committee, he repeatedly helped build bipartisan consensus within the House, and between Congress and the Executive Branch. A long-time senior member on the House Judiciary Committee, Congressman Berman chaired the Subcommittee on Courts, the Internet and Intellectual Property, where he successfully led efforts resulting in major changes to intellectual property laws affecting the entertainment and high-tech industries. In addition to the Board of Directors of the Pacific Council, he serves of the Board of the National Democratic Institute and on the Board of Trustees of the Asia Foundation.

Mr. Austin Beutner

Austin Beutner is the former Publisher and CEO of the Los Angeles Times and the San Diego Union-Tribune, and the first Publisher to serve in both roles. Earlier in his career, he worked at The Blackstone Group, and at age 29 became the firm's youngest partner. He left Blackstone to serve in the U.S. government, where he led efforts to help Russia transition to a market economy after the collapse of the Soviet Union. He went on to found Evercore Partners and as President and Co-CEO built the firm into one of the leading independent investment banks in the world. In 2010, he accepted a \$1 annual salary to serve as First Deputy Mayor and Jobs Czar for the City of Los Angeles. He currently serves on the Boards of The California Nature Conservancy, the Mammoth Mountain Community Foundation, the National Park Foundation, the Pacific Council on International Relations and the U.S. Ski and Snowboard Team Foundation; and is a member of the American Academy of Arts & Sciences and the Council on Foreign Relations. He is the former Chairman of the Board of CalArts and The Broad Stage. In 2012, he created Vision To Learn, a nonprofit that provides free eyeglasses to children in low-income communities in California, Delaware, Hawaii, Iowa and Maryland.

Under her leadership, UWGLA raised \$59.3 million in its 2007-08 campaign year. Elise has been instrumental in transforming UWGLA from its historical fundraising role into a community impact organization that identifies social issues, convenes experts, partners with other organizations and crafts innovative solutions and policy. Under her leadership, UWGLA has launched a strategic 10-year action plan called Creating Pathways Out of Poverty to help tackle poverty in L.A. County through ten comprehensive goals with community and programmatic results. This new plan focuses on the three critical issues driving the social and economic trends in the County: meeting basic needs, improving educational achievement and helping families gain financial stability. Elise presently serves on the City of Los Angeles Workforce Investment Board, as a Senior Fellow for the UCLA School of Public Affairs, on the Advisory Board for the USC School of Policy, Planning and

Development Master of Public Administration program and on the boards of the Los Angeles Area Chamber of Commerce and Southern California Grantmakers.

The Hon. Michael C. Camuñez

Mr. Michael Camuñez is the President and CEO of ManattJones Global Strategies and a director of the Pacific Council on International Policy. ManattJones is the international consulting subsidiary of Manatt, Phelps & Phillips, LLP, where he is also a partner in the firm's Government & Regulatory division. From 2010 to 2013 he served as the Assistant Secretary of Commerce for Market Access and Compliance, where he managed a global portfolio to help lead the U.S. government's efforts to open new markets for U.S. goods and services, identify and eliminate significant market access challenges and non-tariff barriers, and monitor and enforce U.S. trade agreements and commitments. As Assistant Secretary, Mr. Camuñez visited more than 30 countries to advance U.S. trade and economic policy and held key leadership positions in a wide range of bilateral trade dialogues with developed and emerging markets in Sub-Saharan Africa, Europe and Eurasia, Asia and Latin America. He played a critical role in rebalancing U.S. economic policy toward Mexico, and was the chief architect of the U.S.-Mexico High Level Economic Dialogue. Concurrent with his service as Assistant Secretary, Mr. Camuñez was appointed by President Obama to the U.S. Commission on Security and Cooperation in Europe (the Helsinki Commission), to lead the Economic Dimension of the Commission's work through the Organization for Security and Co-operation in Europe (OSCE) in Vienna. He previously served in the Obama White House as Special Counsel to the President in the Office of the White House Counsel as well as Special Assistant to the President. Before joining the White House staff, Mr. Camuñez was a partner at O'Melveny & Myers LLP. He served as a Senior Policy Advisor in the first term of the Clinton Administration, where he was part of the team that created and launched the AmeriCorps program in 1993.

Mr. Chen currently holds the position of Chairman in Eyon Holding Group. He is also the Vice-Chairman of Taiwan Air Cargo Terminal Corporation and Taian Insurance Co., Ltd. In addition, he serves as a board member of China Airlines, and holds many other local and foreign directorships. Mr. Chen was the Chairman of the UTAC Group, the world's no. 5 semiconductor back-end services provider in 2006, between 2000 and 2007. He was also the Chairman of Epistar Corporation, a world leading LED chip company, between 2005 and 2007. Mr. Chen is the Co-President of Chen Yung Foundation and Formosa Cancer Foundation in Taiwan. He was Mattel's Chairman and CEO from 2000 to 2011, and he continued as Chairman through 2012. Under Bob's leadership, Mattel delivered strong growth, improved operating margins, and generated over \$8.2 billion of cash flow. Prior to Mattel, Bob was President and CEO of Kraft Foods, where he was responsible for overseeing all of Kraft's business units. Previously, Bob was President of Kraft's Oscar Mayer Foods division. Bob currently serves on the Board of Directors of

McDonald's Corporation, Levi Strauss & Co., Amgen, Inc., Enjoy Beer Holdings, LLC and Eyemart Express Holdings, LLC. He is a member of the Eller College National Board of Advisors at the University of Arizona, the J. L. Kellogg Graduate School of Management Global Advisory Board at Northwestern University, and the Board of Governors at Pardee Rand Graduate School. He also is a trustee of the Haynes Foundation. Dr. Edgerton specializes in reconstructive plastic surgery including congenital deformities, breast cancer reconstruction, hand surgery, and nerve surgery reconstructions for tumors and paralytic conditions of the face, neck and extremities. He directs the regional Brachial Plexus and Peripheral Nerve Team for Kaiser Permanente and has authored multiple articles and textbook chapters in his field. In addition to his surgical practice, Dr. Edgerton has a long-standing philanthropic interest in security and international policy. The Edgerton Foundation also supports efforts to deal with creative environmental and energy solutions, supports artistic, educational and cultural institutions in Los Angeles, and funds the development of New American Plays nationwide. The Edgerton Foundation has supported lecture series on South Asian Security and Turkey & Iran at the Pacific Council. Mr. Richard Goetz

Mr. Richard B. Goetz is a partner at O'Melveny & Myers LLP. He leads the firm's 200-lawyer Southern California Litigation Practice, and serves on the firm's 7-member Executive Committee. He is a frequent writer on legal issues, and has lectured at Harvard Law School and at the UCLA Henry Samueli School of Engineering and Applied Science. Rich Co-Chairs the Council's Guantanamo Bay Task Force, and was the Council's first official observer of the Guantanamo proceedings against those charged with planning the 9/11 attacks. He also joined the Council's delegation to North Korea, and co-authored the trip report. Rich is active in the Los Angeles County Bar Association, and is a longtime member of its Judicial Appointments Committee. He serves on the Executive Committee of Volunteers of America of Los Angeles, and the boards of directors of Uncommon Good and the Saks Institute for Mental Health Law, Policy, and Ethics at USC Gould School of Law. Mr. Russell Goldsmith

Chairman and Chief Executive Officer, City National Bank and City National Corporation

As chairman and chief executive officer of City National City National Bank, Russell Goldsmith leads America's 23rd largest commercial bank with \$30.8 billion in total assets. Additionally, he serves as chairman and chief executive officer of its publicly held parent company, City National Corporation, which is listed on the New York Stock Exchange (CYN) and headquartered in Los Angeles, California. He has been a director of both the bank and its parent company since 1978. Since Mr. Goldsmith became CEO in October 1995, City National's assets have increased more than 900 percent. Today, it has 77 banking offices in Southern California, the San Francisco Bay Area, Nevada, New York City, Nashville and Atlanta. Additionally, the company and its investment affiliates manage

or administer \$65.8 billion in client investment assets, including \$47.1 billion under direct management. From 2008 through 2011, Mr. Goldsmith was a member of the Federal Reserve Board's 12-member Federal Advisory Council, representing the Twelfth Federal Reserve District, and its vice president for two years. He chairs the Mid-Size Bank Coalition of America, which is composed of 44 mid-sized banks in 43 states, the District of Columbia and three U.S. territories. Mr. Goldsmith also chairs the Los Angeles Coalition for the Economy & Jobs, an independent organization of leading economic stakeholders representing business, labor, higher education and the nonprofit sectors. He previously served as chairman of the Los Angeles Economy & Jobs Committee, which was formed by former Los Angeles Mayor Antonio Villaraigosa. In 2013, Mr. Goldsmith was named "Business Person of the Year" by the *Los Angeles Business Journal*, which cited not only his leadership of City National Bank but also his role as an advocate for economic growth and job creation. Mr. Goldsmith serves on the board of trustees of the Harvard-Westlake School and is a member of the Council on Foreign Relations. From 1986 until its sale in 1994, Mr. Goldsmith was chairman of the board and chief executive officer of publicly held Republic Pictures Corporation, a leading global independent entertainment production and distribution company. He also was vice chairman of the San Diego Padres Baseball Club from 1990 to 1994. He previously served as chief operating officer and a director of Lorimar, Inc., a public entertainment company, from 1983 through 1985. Mr. Goldsmith began his professional career as an attorney, practicing at Irell & Manella, and later co-founded his own law firm, Sanders, Barnet & Goldsmith. He is a graduate of Harvard College and Harvard Law School.

Antonia Hernández is nationally regarded for a career spanning three decades in social justice, expertise in philanthropy and the nonprofit sector, and a lifelong devotion to underserved communities. Under his leadership, Ticketmaster was transformed from a small startup ticketing company with under \$1 million in annual ticket sales in 1982 into the world's leading computerized ticketing service – with a powerful global brand synonymous with ticketing, a pioneering internet presence and more than \$2.4 billion in annual ticket sales. Ticketmaster went public in the fall of 1996 and was sold to USA Networks in 1998, creating substantial value for Ticketmaster shareholders. Fredric D. Rosen served as Chairman and CEO of Stone Canyon Entertainment, the largest operator of traveling amusement parks in North America from 2005 – 2008. He currently serves as a Board member of Double Eagle Acquisition Corp, and served as director of Prime Focus World from 2012 - 2015. Among his many community and philanthropic interests in Los Angeles: he was a trustee of Crossroads School for 16 years; he is a Board Trustee and member of the American Academy of Dramatic Arts; a Founding Board member of the Wallis Annenberg Cultural Center in Beverly Hills and a member of the Board of Governors of Cedars Sinai Medical Center. He is currently a Director and Member of the Executive Committee of the Pacific Council. Over the years, Mr. Rosen has been recognized for both his philanthropic activities and entrepreneurship, including receiving the City Of Hope's "Spirit of Life" Award in 1994; the Ellis Island Medal of Honor in 1993; University of Southern California's "Entrepreneur of the Year" award in 1989; he was honored by the Actor's Fund in 1997; and received the Social Concern Award from the American Jewish Committee in 1997.

Sloan and Sagansky co-founded Global Eagle Acquisition, which completed its business combination with Row 44 and AIA in January 2013. He and Sagansky also co-founded Silver Eagle, which invested approximately \$273.3 million in Videocon d2h in exchange for equity shares of Videocon d2h represented by ADSs in March 2015. Videocon d2h is a leading direct-to-home pay-TV service provider in India. In September 2015, Sloan became a major founding investor of Double Eagle Acquisition Corp., a new investment vehicle to be headed by Sagansky. The former Chairman and CEO of MGM Studios, Sloan founded SBS Broadcasting in 1990. Over the next decade, he built SBS into the second largest broadcaster in Europe and sold the company for \$2.6 billion in October 2005 to Permira and KKR. Prior to SBS, Sloan served as Chairman of New World Entertainment Ltd. He led New World through a substantial growth period and sold the business in 1989 to Ronald Perelman. From 1976 to 1983, Sloan was a practicing entertainment lawyer with Sloan, Kuppin and Ament, a law firm which he founded in LA. Sloan received his B.A. degree from UCLA in 1973 and J.D. Degree from Loyola Law School in 1976.
